

Growth Groups

Growth Groups exist at Calvary United Methodist Church to help participants take the next steps in their personal spiritual journeys. Personal Spiritual journeys are just that - personal. We are all different, we come from different backgrounds, with different experiences, and we have different needs. At various places on our journey we will need distinctive tools in our life in order for us to grow and mature in our faith. We believe that offering the unique types of groups listed below is an effective way to assist each other in our different phases of spiritual growth. Whether you are just exploring faith, are a faithful Christian, or have been a church goer for many years, we believe there is a group here at Calvary that can help you take your next step on your Discipleship Pathway. Life Groups

Life Groups are made up of people that share a common interest, life stage, or geographic location. They covenant together to meet weekly, bi-weekly, or at least monthly to pray, to study scripture or discipleship practices and to serve beyond the walls of the church every month or two. These groups commit to staying together for at least 12-18 months and have a maximum number of participants.

Covenant Disciple (CD) Groups

A Covenant Disciple Group is a confidential group made up of 5-7 individuals who meet together for one hour every week (or every other week) to hold each other mutually accountable for their discipleship. Groups tend to form based on the availability of the participants. The purpose of the regular meetings is mutual accountability and support for discipleship. The group is guided by the covenant they write, which is shaped by the General Rule of Discipleship:

To witness to Jesus Christ in the world and to follow his teachings through acts of compassion, justice, worship, and devotion under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The covenant serves as an agenda for the meetings and keeps the focus of the conversation on discipleship. Members of the group share what they have done or have not done during the past week(s) to follow the teachings of Jesus in their daily lives.

Fellowship Groups

These eclectic groups gather with each other on a regular basis for Christian fellowship. These groups gather with one another over a meal, special event, or activity. These groups can meet at church or off-site. A time of prayer and devotion is encouraged, but a Fellowship Group's main focus is spending time to together to CONNECT with Christ at the center. Fellowship Groups can have as few as 5 and as many as 30+ participants. Fellowship Groups are encouraged to gather as often as they like but at least once a quarter.





Serving Groups

These groups exist for the purpose of serving together. In addition to serving at Calvary, they recognize that Jesus calls us to serve beyond our walls. Serving groups may gather for a mission trip or for a once and done service activity outside our church's doors. They may meet regularly to serve together at local soup kitchen or homeless shelter, or they may meet to fulfill a need within our very own community. Jesus came not to be served but to serve. As followers of Christ, we too are called to serve in the world.

Learning Groups

Learning groups are focused on a wide variety of topics viewed through the Christian lens. These Christ-centered groups get together at regular intervals for conversation centered on a topic, theme, book, or scripture. These groups pray with and for one another. They may include short-term studies, seasonal studies, or long-term studies. These groups meet on Sundays during our Faith Formation time (10:10-10:50) as well as throughout the week. The Learning Groups meet here at church, off -site at homes, or at local businesses. The emphasis of Learning Groups is on taking personal ownership of our relationship with Jesus through attention to our spiritual disciplines. Participants in these groups are living out their faith within the context of a community of believers. Learning Groups can have as few as 5 and as many as 25 participants.
